## American Government 2016-2017

American Government gives a foundation in the knowledge of values, principles, and historical events, which have shaped the United States' government and the Illinois' state government.

Students must pass both the US and Illinois Constitutions with an 80% and the American Government class with a 65% to graduate from Elmwood High School.

### Units of instruction include

- a review of the basic principles of government
- a study of the US Constitution
- civil rights and civil liberties
- the legislative process, lawmaking powers and how laws are made in a democratic society
- leadership through the executive branch of government and the power of the bureaucracy to carry out policies
- the courts system and legal processes at the national, state and local levels
- State and local government systems, the IL Constitution

#### Rules

Example – Johnny got a 90 on his semester exam, an 85 1<sup>st</sup> nine weeks, a 75 the 2<sup>nd</sup> nine weeks, a 93 on the US Constitution Test, and a 80 on the Illinois Constitution Test.

90(.10) + 85(.30) + 75(.30) + 93(.20) + 80(.10) = 9+25.5+22.5+18.6+8.0 = 84
